Dear Parents and Carers,

I am sure you will have noticed from my previous messages that the exam season is now fully upon us and from next week we will be changing the College timetable and having an early lunch from 12.25 – 1.10pm to accommodate afternoon exams. Very best wishes to all of our Year 11 and Year 13 students and thank you in advance to parents and carers for your ongoing support over the next few weeks. I am pleased to share that feedback from our invigilation team reflects admirably on our students' behaviour and composure during their exams.

While we strive for the best outcomes academically, it is important to reassure your child that grades do not define them as a person: their worth as individuals remains constant, regardless of exam results. For those not taking an exam, please would you remind them of the importance of being considerate to all those who are. Whilst the majority of the exams are held in the main hall, we also have exams taking place in small venues such as offices, meeting rooms and IT4. This means students need to pay attention to the signage, be mindful of where the exams are taking place and keep noise to a minimum as they move around the College.

With the arrival of warmer weather, students may opt to remove their school jumpers, however all other uniform should continue to be worn correctly. Ensuring your child stays hydrated throughout the day is important, and there are ample opportunities for your child to refill their water bottles throughout the day. However, please stress the importance of students taking responsibility to allocate enough time for refilling their bottles to avoid lateness to lessons. Additionally, please ensure your child has a sufficiently large water bottle to last them the entire day or at least sustain them for a minimum of two lessons, as there is no time for refills between classes.

Finally good luck to all our students who are taking part in the Ten Tors Challenge this weekend, I look forward to seeing you all at the finish.

#### **Reporting an Absence**

Parents are expected to inform us of their child's absence before 9.00 a.m. on each day of absence providing the reason for absence. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness. If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. In addition, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if your child is absent from College due to illness.

#### Lateness

The school day (first registration session) starts at 8.50 am, all students are expected to be in their classroom at this time.

### **Medical Appointments**

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. We ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment if they can.

Please give the school as much notice as possible, at least two weeks' notice is useful.

If the appointment requires the pupil to leave during the day, they must be signed out by an adult listed on the student's record at the main reception.
