Principal's Update

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of a very successful first half term, I want to highlight how well our students have settled back into school life. Year 7 have made a smooth transition into secondary school, Year 10 have embraced the start of their Key Stage 4 courses with enthusiasm, and Year 11 have shown great focus and engagement. If you have a child in Year 11, please encourage them to begin their revision in preparation for the upcoming mock exams next term, as starting early will give them the best chance of success.

It's been great to see more students cycling to College, as it promotes eco-friendly travel while also encouraging physical activity and independence—values we fully support. Due to the increased demand for bike storage, we've upgraded our facilities. Students can now secure their bikes in an enclosed shelter located in the main car park, just outside the front reception. We ask that parents ensure their child feels confident cycling and remind all students that they must wear a helmet, visible clothing, and follow traffic rules at all times.

In response to student feedback, we have made a small adjustment to our uniform policy—with the colder weather approaching students are now permitted to wear plain black socks with their tights if they wish. They represented Clyst Vale brilliantly, and we are incredibly proud of their behaviour and engagement. The visit provided an invaluable insight into university life and helped students start thinking about their future pathways. We hope this experience has inspired them as they begin planning for their next steps.

Sports Updates and Fixtures

Round 2 U15s Girls PlayStation Cup: Clyst Vale vs Tiverton 17th November 2024

Round 3 saw the girls drawn against local rivals Tiverton who they have had some great success over in the last few meetings. A strong squad of 15 players were available for Clyst Vale with the return of some key players; Miley A, Ameera C, and Sophia B who were unavailable in the previous round. The girls lined up with Sophie W stepping up to go in between the posts with a strong back four of Zoe T, Miley A, and Ameera C, a midfield 4 of Tallulah W, Grace A, Sophia B and Leona W with a strike partnership, Sophia T and Daisy H. Lana Z, Wiktoria J and Kate DW made up the substitutes.

A bright start from Clyst Vale who were pressing the Tiverton defence to try and force a mistake. Sophia T had the ball down the left wing passing two of the Tiverton midfields, cut inside onto her right foot to swing in a half cross half shot which deflected off the defender and in for 1-0 Clyst Vale. Grace was second on the scoresheet when a long ball over the top of the defenders saw Grace run onto the ball unmarked with a 1 on 1 with the keeper. She composed herself and slotted it into the corner for 2-0. A corner to Clyst Vale was swung in by the ever-reliable Daisy, who whipped in a dangerous ball which caused some confusion in the box and the ball bounced kindly to Leona who volleyed the ball home for 3-0. Clyst Vale continued to defend well and shut out any Tiverton attacks. Sophie was cool, calm and collected in goal and swept up any long balls over the top with ease. Daisy was next on the score sheet has her quick reactions and speed onto a ball over the top enable her to skip past the rushing keeper and slot it into an open net for 4-0 at half time.

Reporting an Absence

Parents are expected to inform us of their child's absence before 9.00 a.m. on each day of absence providing the reason for absence. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness. If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. In addition, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if your child is absent from College due to illness.

Lateness

The school day (first registration session) starts at 8.50 am, all students are expected to be in their classroom at this time.


Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. We ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment if they can.

Please give the school as much notice as possible, at least two weeks' notice is useful.

If the appointment requires the pupil to leave during the day, they must be signed out by an adult listed on the student's record at the main reception.
