Principal's Update







Dear Parents and Carers,

We are incredibly proud of our status as a 'Gold' Rights Respecting School and there are many areas of college life where we embed the Convention on the Rights of the Child; it is incorporated into our taught curriculum; it underpins how staff interact with students and it is referenced explicitly in our policies and practice. Putting young people at the centre of everything we do (Article 3 – Best interests of the child) involves ensuring we provide opportunities for students to express their views and feedback on key issues that impact them. This week members of our Student Board delivered assemblies to all year groups on the theme of democracy. They explained how students can ensure their voice is heard and outlined the process for the upcoming elections to the Student Board. Please discuss this your child and if they are keen to put themselves forward, the process for applying is detailed in the Allstudent Team. If you would like to find out more about the Articles that underpin the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child you can find more information on the following website: https://www.unicef.org.uk/what-we-do/un-convention-child-rights/.

In addition to teaching students about their rights, it is also important to stress that students need to take responsibility for their own learning and behaviour. We acknowledge that people make mistakes, and this is a key part of the learning process. However, it is important for students to respond appropriately when this happens. Your support in addressing behaviour issues is crucial. To that end, I have asked my Pastoral Deputy, Mr Sutton, to update you on some of the key changes in our approach to improving behaviour and upholding our expectations as well as how we are working hard to embed a culture that acknowledges and celebrates achievement and success. More information about this can be found in the accompanying letter to this newsletter.

Finally, I would like to end this week's newsletter by congratulating all of our Year 11 Art students who have completed their Art exam this week. Art teachers have commented on how impressed they have been with their maturity and focus in managing this exam. Students have excelled and produced some outstanding final pieces. Next week it will be the Speaking exams for MFL – good luck to all the students who are preparing for these.

Downing College, Cambridge visit for Y12, Y10, Y9 & Y8



We'd like to offer our very sincere thanks to Rosie Gough, who travelled here from Downing College, Cambridge on Tuesday. As a School Liaison Officer, Rosie was here to speak to groups of Year 12, Year 10, Year 9 and Year 8 students about the idea of University and where Oxbridge fits into that. Rosie is an English Literature graduate of Downing College, and therefore perfectly placed to share her knowledge and experience.

Rosie discussed general themes regarding University with some more detail about Oxford, Cambridge and the differences between the two. She covered different types of university (campus, city & collegiate), the college system and how colleges differ. Rosie explained that learning at university takes different forms and spoke about lectures, seminars, practicals, field trips and self-study. Details about all of the courses on offer at Cambridge were also covered. Finally, societies, traditions, accommodation and financial support were mentioned, as well as what type of student Oxbridge is most suitable for and how you would go about engaging with the institutions to find out more. During her session with Year 12 and Year 10, Rosie also included information about the admissions process and interviews, and what admissions tutors are looking for when they review applications. She also talked about entry requirements and the specific subjects needed for certain courses.

Well done to all the groups who attended Rosie's sessions for their impeccable behaviour and their level of engagement – you were all fantastic ambassadors for Clyst Vale! We really enjoyed having Rosie with us and hearing everything she had to say - we very much look forward to welcoming her back in the future.



Welcome to our new half-termly reading newsletter. In each edition, we will recommend books from a variety of styles and genres, to inspire readers across all year groups.





This put more pressure on the Exmouth midfield and created chances to counter attack. 15 minutes into the second half Ethan was at it again from a break off a corner, Daniil went racing up the left hand side and delayed the cross to allow others to arrive. The ball was pulled back before Ethan calmly jinxed the defenders and slotted it home. 2-1. Clystvale absorbed the pressure for the next ten minutes with Exmouth pushing for the equaliser. But the boys saved their best goal till last. Charlie received the ball and dribbled towards the centre back about 25 yards out. Shifted the ball to his right, opened up his body and finessed it into the top right hand corner to give Clystvale a 2 goal cushion. 3-1.

The game finished 3-1 and we move into the final to face St Peters who they beat in the group 3-1. An excellent display from everyone involved with the final being played at Cullompton Rangers FC on Wednesday 1st May @4.

Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

Reporting an Absence

Parents are expected to inform us of their child's absence before 9.00 a.m. on each day of absence providing the reason for absence. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness. If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. In addition, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if your child is absent from College due to illness.

Lateness

The school day (first registration session) starts at 8.50 am, all students are expected to be in their classroom at this time.

Medical Appointments

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. We ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment if they can.

Please give the school as much notice as possible, at least two weeks' notice is useful.

If the appointment requires the pupil to leave during the day, they must be signed out by an adult listed on the student's record at the main reception.
